Principal's Report - Bob Bender

- 5th grade DC trip is coming up in December. DOE rules mandate that overnight trips still
 require everyone to be vaccinated. Therefore, for both the 4th grade camping trip and the 5th
 grade DC trip, children and chaperones must be fully vaccinated (meaning 2 shots) 2 weeks
 before the trip occurs.
- 2nd graders are receiving chess instruction in class.
- 3rd graders are rehearsing for their show. The show will be on the morning of 11/23.
- Teachers are in the midst of professional development from Teachers College's Reading and Writing Project. They are focusing on the science of reading, phonemic teaching and the understanding of phonics.
- Staff have also been working with a Math specialist from District 2 on the schoolwide goal for improving access to all students to grade level content.
- PS11 Admin and a team of volunteers to visit the new families in the hotel shelter after this
 meeting to welcome our new families.

New families to PS11

- Jeff Gardner is leading the committee to help incoming asylum seeking families. The donations have been tremendous and families have been so grateful.
 - The committee is in the process of setting up communications around the families' needs. There is a very urgent need for basic supplies, including soap, toothbrushes, shampoo, clean underwear, clean clothing, water bottles and backpacks. Pre-sorting clothing donations based on age and sex would be tremendously helpful. We anticipate this to be an ongoing effort for at least a few more weeks and that things will continue to evolve.
- There will be a sign up sheet sent out for volunteer duties:
 - In urgent need of fluent Spanish speakers to help families while they're in the store, with school registration, and to welcome them to the school (must be members of the PS 11 community).
 - Volunteers needed for donation collection, to sort through items and work in the store.
- Amazon wish list to help fulfill most urgent and needed items: <u>Amazon.com</u>
- The school has always provided services for English Language Learning, so there are already services in place. There may be a need for more resources, but it is unclear how many students there will be, so the resource need is therefore also unclear.
- Amazon deliveries that arrive during school hours are brought into the building not left outside. When they arrive on a weekend or in the evening after the school closes at 6 pm, the packages are unable to be delivered, and the delivery is attempted again on a subsequent day.
- Donation drop-offs cannot take place during weekend hours.
- Accepting donations of diapers and baby formula.



Safety Update

- Safety is a top priority. Thanks to the community, the school was able to get the 2nd safety
 officer back at school and police presence during drop-off and pick-up.
- Earlier this week, Lisa Cox, Joanna Cohn Weiss, Dave Cox and members of the administration (Cassandra Gregov, Dawn Rosevear, and Bob Bender) attended a meeting with Erik Bottcher, Brad Hoylman, Dick Godfrey, the DA's office, the Office of Special Narcotics, the Department of Homeless, and other community groups. It was hugely beneficial to have everyone in the same room together to develop a more coordinated response. A list of 14 "to-do's" emerged following the meeting. These groups will stay on the case and ensure that improvements continue.
