

PTA General Meeting November 18, 2022 Meeting Minutes

Principal's Report - Bob Bender

- DOE has acknowledged that it owes the school funding; we have received more than half thus
 far and the remaining money should be coming into the budget in January
- We were able to hire a new ENL (English as a New Language) teacher, who will start on November 28th
- There is currently a hiring freeze on paraprofessionals, but we have been given permission to hire Spanish-speaking paraprofessionals for the classrooms
- Spanish chess lessons with Russ began today for the new students; lessons will be happening every Friday in the classrooms. Chess lessons are held in classrooms for grades 1-3.
 Currently 2nd graders are receiving chess lessons; 1st graders will have it in the next cycle, and then 3rd graders
- Realized there is a need for bilingual counseling sessions; will have them available for the next
 3 Fridays
- 3rd grade show is next Wednesday, November 23. Attendees must show proof of vaccination.
- There was an incident outside the school building yesterday; an individual made verbal threats
 to the school safety officer, who then called the police. The systems in place to safeguard the
 school and students worked perfectly. The shelter-in lasted about 8 minutes, NYPD stayed on
 site until 6 pm.
 - During a shelter-in, the school is in "business as usual" mode inside. An announcement is made to say the building is in shelter-in; the kids inside are free to move about the school. Any kids on the playground are brought inside. A member of the building response team stays at each entrance to ensure no one is coming in or out
- Girls' locker room has been flooding due to hair in the drains; custodian will be alerted



- A location was found for Project Rousseau meetings with the new families at a church in Chelsea
- Gratitude to Jeff Gardner for introducing PS11 to the organization, Helen Keller International.
 When new families crossed the border, many kids and adults had to give up all their eyeglasses. The organization will provide free exams and eyeglasses to EVERY child at PS11 where needed!

- Family Fridays are being brought back on a smaller scale to prevent classrooms from being overcrowded. Classes will be divided into two cohorts, A and B, and will alternate visits; there will also be grade level activities to enable families to engage with the school

Parent Coordinator's Report - Stephen McGill

- Middle school application deadline is December 1st. Anyone who has not received their
 welcome letter to log in to MySchools should contact Christine Leonhardt immediately:
 cleonha@schools.nyc.gov. She is the middle school liaison for PS11. Families can contact her
 for their welcome letters with their MySchools login information and any questions about
 school options
- NYC Schools account many families still do not have their accounts set up. Please make sure your account is set up and check that your address is correct. The welcome letter gets mailed to the address in that account. Completing a "blue card" for school does not change your address in the DOE's system. If you need to change your address, you must show proof of your new address to the school secretary and she can manually change it in the system. It is important to have a NYC Schools account so that you can access your child's records, grades, etc.
- DOE has a "No Head Lice" policy in schools, which means schools cannot have head lice. If you discover that your child has head lice, it is very important to inform the school so that the school can inform everyone else in class to keep an eye out for it, to prevent an infestation. The official policy is to have your child's pediatrician clear your child before they can return to school. To clear up any misconceptions, clean hair is a breeding ground for lice. The school conducts lice checks twice a year once in the fall and once in the spring. If you do find that your child has lice, there are companies that conduct head lice checks and treat it. There is also a wealth of information available online

- Young Artists Program is an 8-week program starting in mid-January. Each class consists of 10 kids; there will be multiple classes, depending on the number of parent volunteers and kids. The program takes place during lunch, and at the end of the program, all art projects are put on display. Projects in the past have included: collages, portraits, photography, cake decorating, yoga with a drawing component, claymation, and more.
 - Parent volunteers must go through the fingerprinting process because it involves parents teaching in the school. It would be appreciated if parents can pay for their own fingerprinting so that funds can be used for art project materials. This is an incredibly rewarding program for parents volunteers don't need to be professional artists; they just need to have crafting skills and be good at creating projects for the kids.
