Principal's Report - Bob Bender

- Gratitude to Jeff Gardner and the army of volunteers who have been helping at the school all day, every day to welcome our new families
- Rosie's Theater Performance by 5th graders. All family members are invited to attend but must show proof of vaccination. 4th graders will also attend.
- Family Fridays have started. They have been a great success families and teachers are providing great feedback.
- 5th Grade Trip to Washington, DC was incredible. Gratitude to Cassandra and the many staff and parent volunteers. Many thanks to the PTA for funding the entire trip for all the students.
- Teachers have access to math training. The work is daring, exciting, and inspiring.
- Construction update: some parts of the scaffolding may be coming down in early Spring. The small play yard may also open in the Spring.
- City-wide, schools are having difficulty finding substitute teachers. The school is having to rewrite schedules because of this. If anyone knows people who can nominate substitute teachers, please do so.
- The school is in need of bilingual Spanish speaking paraprofessionals. The role requires a high school diploma, and individuals must be fluent in English and Spanish. Nominations must be made by next week, before the holiday break. Hours are from 8 am 2:45 pm. Email Bob immediately if you have nominees. Part time is ok, but individuals must be able to commit to 20 days.
- The school is in need of bilingual mental health services. The SLT is working with Hudson Guild, Catholic Charities, and other organizations. Anyone who is knowledgeable about receiving free mental health services, please reach out.



- The Helen Keller organization will be providing free eye exams to all students; any student who needs them will receive free Warby Parker glasses (kids will pick out the color of the frames).
- The school is starting school tours again for incoming Kindergarten families after the holidays. There will be three tours following the break.
- Chicken pox the school is required to notify anyone who has been exposed. This means being in any space e.g., the cafeteria, auditorium, classroom, or a bus with the individual. Please remind children to wash their hands regularly.
- Please do not send any sick children to school. The school is having to send home kids from school every day with fever and other symptoms.

Parent Coordinator's Report – Stephen McGill

- School tours are taking place this winter; information and links to sign up for the tours are posted on the PS 11 website.
- Kindergarten applications are currently open. Please go onto the DOE website: schools.nyc.gov. Look within the enrollment section and click on the grade for which you're enrolling. (Click on Kindergarten or pre-K.) The Kindergarten application is live; the deadline is January 20, 2023. Families who are applying for Kindergarten with siblings - please make sure to flag any siblings and their OSIS numbers on the applications.
- Kindergarten G&T applications are also now open and available for parents to apply.
- Pre-K applications are not yet open; they will open after the first of the year. Parents who are interested in pre-K can sign up for DOE alerts to be contacted as soon as applications are available.
- The DOE recommends for every parent to have a NYC Schools Account (NYCSA) and recently sent home letters to parents without NYCSA accounts
 - If you receive a letter, that means you do not have an account and need to open one. The NYCSA account is for you to see your children's grades, transportation information, etc.
 - The MySchools account is only for applying to programs and schools.
 - These are two different accounts.
 - Two parents are on each child's account both will receive a letter asking them to open a NYCSA. They don't need to both create an account, but will need to return the form



saying they don't want the account. There's no harm in having two parents have two separate accounts.

- Discussed family engagement and support
- Feedback about new Family Friday structure has been positive

- As the year comes to an end, we want to express gratitude for this community. Thank you to the PTA for paying for the 5th grade Washington, DC trip. Programs like Rosie's Theater are so meaningful. What you contribute does so much for the school.
- Safety Update from Dave Cox:



- Tactically, we are still pushing for as much presence by the NYPD as possible. We are working with various law enforcement agencies to ensure arrests for criminal behavior and support for those struggling with mental health and substance abuse issues. The school had a meeting with narcotics officers, homeless organizations, Senator Hoylman and Councilman Bottcher regarding Rainbow Station.
- Scaffolding at school may come down in first quarter of 2023; this has been a rolling deadline
- DA announced a new initiative this week for those struggling with mental health and substance abuse issues - have flagged a need in Chelsea. This will take time to ramp up (likely 6 months), but we are hopeful that this will help.
- We are proposing a safety meeting over Zoom.
- If you see anything concerning, the first step is to always call 911
- Overall, it seems that school hours drop off and pick up feel better. There is a robust safety committee at the school which is in constant contact with the local 10th precinct.
- Catherine Casalino volunteered to update the PS 11 logo, representing KG&G and our place in the community. Her son is a student at the school and her husband happens to also be a PS 11 alum. The red bird is the new mascot for the school, and the number "11" serves as its feet. Catherine created the font on her own.
