Principal's Report - Bob Bender

- In September, PS 11 will be reinstating the safety protocol of having parent-issued IDs sign ups have been sent out for Pre K, K, and 1st grade families to come in and have them made. The ID's from several years ago are still ok to use. PS 11 started to create new ID's last year where parents had to show their vaccination status to get into the building. The school no longer has to check vaccination status, so the old ID's can be re-used
- School photo retakes from Stomping Ground were taken recently. Photos will be available by March 23; final deadline to order photos is April 7. After that date, you can still order the photos, but the PTA won't receive any percentages from the order

- SLT met this week, on Tuesday
- Family engagement and support
 - Family Literacy Program a workshop cycle for 15-20 Spanish speaking caregivers 90 mins over 3 non-consecutive days. Discussed issues around timing and who would oversee the program on site. The Chair of the SLT will summarize it in a one-pager and determine interest. This will be held after school.
 - There is a proposal to make a connection with the Whitney Museum this will get underway as the weather warms up, as it involves walking there
 - June End of Year Potluck there are 4 committees, including safety/permits, food/beverage, volunteers, promotion. SLT discussed all items and will be working with the heads of the PTA to discuss finances, volunteers, and circulating sign-up sheets. We will need volunteers, and the SLT will also be participating.
- Physical and mental health/safety
 - Online safety for children Mr. Fier will be leading this and will create a flyer to share with parents; SLT will also connect with the PTA about this
 - Still need onsite social work and counseling support for new families please circulate the following blurb to anyone who might be interested and is bilingual.
 - PS11 is hiring a part time (2 days a week) Bi-Lingual (Spanish) Social worker or guidance counselor. This position will be supporting the social emotional needs of Spanish-speaking students.
- Comprehensive education plan Math and Phonics teams are working on the curriculum, and all looks very positive
- New business:
 - Class sizes have gotten larger



- 3 Full Time ENL teachers, more paraprofessionals coming in all are finally getting processed
- Some of the new families have moved to other parts of the state/NYC; others are still here
- Chess instruction is happening in Spanish and English, the children are having a very positive experience
