- E. **Community Goal Updates:** The majority of the November meeting was spent discussing findings from 25+ articles SLT read on homework. Overall, the research done on the importance and value of homework is mixed; it is difficult in many cases to determine causation versus correlation. SLT believes if/how homework is transformed should be a reflection of overall PS11 Values. In addition, SLT finds it important to get feedback from teachers, parents, and students about their views on homework. Highlights from the discussion include:
 - 1. Highlights form the research:
 - i. What are effective homework assignments: individualized assignments, fluency, reading
 - ii. Importance of feedback: Receiving feedback is important part of the learning process
 - iii. Need to account for struggling learners to minimize screaming matches and kids not completing homework
 - iv. What is the appropriate parental involvement: Facilitation of completion
 - v. Possible non-cognitive skills gained from homework: study skills, positive attitude, middle school preparedness
 - vi. Appropriate age to introduce homework: Early grades don't show academic benefit except for reading.
 - 2. PS 11 Values: Listed out values PS11 has as a school. Purpose of this exercise was to make sure that the homework policy stays true to the overall values of the school.
 - i. Grit/Resilience/Kindness
 - ii. Family Time: Families should decide how they spend their time before and after school
 - iii. Student Choice and Empowerment/Student Experiences
 - iv. Non-academic Skills: Preparing for higher education and developing study skills
 - v. Parental Involvement
 - vi. Diversity
 - vii. Achievement
 - 3. Forums for how we should receive feedback from school community
 - i. Town Hall meeting with parents
 - ii. Engage student council to get student feedback
 - iii. Teachers
 - 4. Next steps
 - i. Finalize forums to receive feedback and determine questions to ask students/ parents/ teachers at January meeting
 - ii. Continue discussion on what homework should look like
