## **Welcome/Approval of January Minutes**

## **Principal's Report**

High School Musical is February 10th and 11th.

#### Guest Speaker - Aloysee Jarmoszuk

- Mr. Bender introduced the guest speaker from the Department of Education EPA Office who is also a PS11 parent Aloysee Jarmoszuk
- Three representatives from the DOE presented information about The Lead Campaign.
- In September, the New York State regulations changed for testing water. A major change was to test the water on its first draw as opposed to flushing the water first before testing it.
- Over 100 samples were taken at PS11 on January 5<sup>th</sup>.
- The following areas were found to have traces of lead: 17 hose bibs on the exterior of the building, one faucet in the cafeteria and one fountain on the second floor.
- Any pipes or fixtures inside the building that were found to have lead levels above 15-20 parts per billion were shut down and are being replaced. They will not be restored until tests are normal.
- All areas are being addressed. However, the water will never be 100% lead free.
- NYC has the best water in the country. It is clean and lead free because it is treated. If lead is present it is because of a fixture or pipe not the water.

#### Ouestions from parents:

- 1. Does the hose bib on the roof have lead because we water our garden up there? *No*
- 2. Is the kitchen safe? Yes
- 3. What does "elevation" mean? It means that the water coming out of a particular fixture has an elevated lead level that is above 15-20 parts per billion. That is a red flag and action needs to be taken. The fixture and/or pipe will be replaced and the water will be retested. If the lead levels are still above standard, more investigation will take place.
- 4. When will fixtures in the building be replaced? Within the next 2 weeks. The DOE is only replacing drinking fountains inside the building. They will not be replacing the water bibs outside the building.
- 5. Where is the lead coming from? It is coming from the fixtures. There is no lead in NYC water.
