*Participatory Budgeting (Matt Green from Councilman Corey Johnson's office). There's a new initiative happening in our community called Participatory Budgeting. It's a process designed to reallocate a portion of city funds to the communities. It began four years ago in NYC. This is the first time it has taken place in District 3. We want to know what ideas residents have regarding ideas to improve the community in areas like public spaces, libraries, and schools. The process has just started. There will be three meetings happening very soon for people to come out and suggest ideas. Voting on ideas will happen next Spring. Ideas with the most votes win. Anyone 14 or older can vote.
