#### **A. December meeting minutes approved.**

#### **B. Safety Update**

- Bob informed the team that, as per his request, the New York City Special Commissioner of Education was reviewing PS 11's procedures and protocols. PS 11 staff has been re-trained and some protocols have already been updated.
- Bob briefed the team about results of the lead tests. One faucet, used by custodians, was found to contain lead. It has been turned off. Custodians continue to flush all faucets and fountains each morning.

#### **C. CEP Update**

- The team was unable to discuss CEP goals as the necessary data was not yet available. The team will start this discussion at its February meeting.

#### **D. Enrichment**

- The team reviewed an enrichment proposal focused on Online Literacy. The team was in favor of granting the proposal and thought it fit well with the fourth grade unit on journalism and with the work that the PS 11 newspaper is doing in their monthly publication.
- The team discussed the cancellation of Architecture Night. Robin is going to inquire as to whether the parent in charge of Architecture Night would be interested in teaching architecture as an enrichment class for the upper grades.

#### **E. SLT Book Club: We Are Not Yet Equal**

- The Parent Book Club will meet in person on Wednesday 1/16 for their first conversation about this book.
- Jason and Rachel hope to steer the conversation toward how the history of racism affects students today.

#### **F. Emotional Intelligence Family Friday Planning**

- Teachers will introduce the concept of the Mood Meter which charts feelings based on energy and pleasantness, dividing the feelings into four distinct quadrants. To demonstrate to students and families how feelings in each of the quadrants can be both positive and negative the team came up with two scenarios for each quadrant- one positive and one negative. Teachers will present the scenarios during the January Family Friday and use them to start a discussion about how one would feel in a certain scenario and how that feeling could be positive or negative.
